

# GUIDE FOR HOME WORSHIP 10/25

## CALL TO WORSHIP

*Read aloud before clicking play on the musical worship:*

*Come, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and he who has no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen diligently to me; and delight yourselves in rich food. Incline your ear, and come to me; hear that your soul may live. (Isaiah 55:1-3)*

## PRAYER

**Heavenly Father have mercy upon us,** and hear our prayer for the sake of your name and the glory of your kingdom. We confess that we need your Spirit to teach us your ways, and to grieve over the sin inside and outside of us. Would you open our eyes and humble our hearts over the immense privilege of being called children of God. Renew us Lord.
