## A few key quotes and ideas to reflect on:

- **Read 2 Corinthians 3:1-6** and then look at the chart below:

	OLD COVENANT	NEW COVENANT
Where	Stone	Heart
With	Ink	God's Spirit
Style	Letter - Rules (that point to our need for a Redeemer)	Spirit - Values (that come from our Redeemer)

- **Read 2 Corinthians 3:7-11** and then look at the chart below:

- Read 2 Corinthians 3:12-17 and then look at the chart below:

	OLD COVENANT	NEW COVENANT
Communication	Veiled	Candid
Understanding	Dull	Free

### **ASK:**

- Now ask just a few simple questions:
  - **Read 3:1-6 again.** What has God been writing on your heart? How is it helping you experience real life ("resurrection life" where you are actually desiring to obey God's law)?
  - **Read 3:7-11 again.** How does it shape your thinking knowing that in Christ you actually have God's righteousness assigned to you? (Does this not blow your mind?)
  - **Read 3:18** In what ways can you see God producing an ongoing transformation of heart in you?
  - **Look at the chart below.** What about God's character captivates you? What needs to captivate you more?

God's Greatness	Omnipresent (Psalm 139:7-8), Omnipotent (Psalm 62:11), Omniscient (Romans 11:33-34)
God's Goodness	Holy (Isaiah 6:1-5), Just (Psalm 11:7), Love (1 John 4:8-10), True (Romans 3:3-4)
God's Gloriousness	Immutable (James 1:17), Independent (Romans 11:35-36), Infallible (Zephaniah 3:5), Infinite (Job 11:7-9), Invisible (John 4:24)

**PREVIEW** Next week we will be in 2 Corinthians 4:15:10. Spend some time reading this together.

**Read** your selected passage out loud (if studying in a group, all but one person should keep their Bibles closed for now). **Read slowly.** Line by line if you can. **Read as if for the first time. ASK (a guide for this is on the next page)** 

- What does it say? ("Don't be showy....don't be wordy")
- **What do you see?** (picture the scene, the people. What stands out?)
- What happens next? Guess! (say, "I wonder...)
- **What do you hear?** (What word comes to mind after reading? Spend some time in silent prayer before answering. *Why do you think God included this <u>here</u> in the Story?*).
- What do you want to do? (as a result of what Jesus has done)

### **PRAY TOGETHER**

**Worship** God for who He is (His attributes revealed in these passages)

**Confess** the sinful emotions, attitudes, and behaviors that result when we forget who He is **Thank** God for what He has done in Christ and your life

**Ask** God to transform you and to help you apply His word today.

# **LECTIO VISIO**

Christians believe in God's Word and take him at his Word. Yet 21st century Christians have a difficult time seeing God's Word the same way God's people have for centuries: *visually*. That's what this method of Scripture reading is designed to do: help you <u>see</u> the text.

### **3 INGREDIENTS**

3 candles, or a 3 wick candle

1 Passage (preferably narrative, 5-10 verses)

12 or fewer people (Christians or non-Christians)

### 10 COMMANDMENTS OF LECTIO VISIO

- 1. No prep! (Lead by asking)
- 2. Pray simple prayers (tsp prayers: Thank you, Sorry, Please)
- 3. Shut your Bibles (yup, you read that correctly. Don't worry.)
- 4. Open your eyes (senses) and picture the scene. Try to get down in the dust of the story.
- 5. Direct the Film (you as the leader help the biblical scene come alive for those you're studying with)
- 6. No peeking ahead (1 verse at a time)
- 7. No rabbit trails (stick to what the text says, not "I feels")
- 8. Keep telling the story (instead of explaining, WONDER)
- 9. Keep silence
- 10. Lead by asking the 5Qs
- 11. Repeat #2 TSP.

### THE 5 QUESTIONS

- 1. What did it say?
- 2. What do you see?
- 3. What happens next? (Guess)
- 4. What do you hear? (Then/Now)
- 5. What do you want to do?

#### A COUPLE EXTRA TIPS FOR LEADERS

**Mirror the group.** Repeat back what is said and direct them back to the story if things get off track.

**Lead Strong.** God is actually the one leading the discussion by his Word. Take courage. Have fun. Encourage a bit of playfulness.
