Worship is an essential part of the Christian life. Here are <u>a few tips</u> for participating at home:

- **Push through the awkward.** Worshiping this way gets more comfortable with time.
- **Take turns leading** different sections below (Call to worship, prayer, benediction).

CALL TO WORSHIP

Read aloud <u>before</u> <u>clicking play on the musical worship:</u> Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. And into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade - kept in heaven for you, who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. In this greatly rejoice. (1 Peter 1:3-5)

PRAYER Father, we humbly bow before you. What is mankind that you are mindful of us? We are too entitled to the trivial things in life. We are too proud in our own eyes, and we hold on to past hurts that reap the bitterness of a controlled life. **Lord, we need help.** Please deliver us from how we've placed ourselves, our nation and our future prosperity into our own hands. You are the salvation that we need. We believe in Jesus, your son. Help our unbelief. Seal us with the assurance that grabbed our hearts from when we first believed. We put our hope solely in you, our refuge and strength. **In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.**

READ Philippians 3:1-14 slowly as if for the 1st time. Mark down what you observe as you read/hear. Use the **COMMA Questions** and **Daily Devo** for additional insights.

ASK

Pick a few of these questions and ask them as a group as you study the passage together.

CONTEXT:

What was the main point of the passage immediately before this one? What has happened so far in the letter?

OBSERVATION:

What seems to be the main point or points?

What sort of change does the author seem to be trying to bring about in the audience? In us? What surprises you?

MEANING:

How does this text relate to other parts of the book?

How does the passage relate to Jesus? How does He fulfill this command/ ideal/principle?

What does this passage this teach you about God?

Why do you think God put this in the Bible?

How could you sum up the meaning of this passage in your own words?

MEDITATION:

Adoration: How can I love and praise God on the basis of what I've read? E

Repentance: How do I fail to realize this in my life? What wrong behavior, harmful emotions or

attitudes result when I forget this?

Gospel Thanks: How can I thank Jesus as the ultimate revelation of this attribute of God and the

ultimate answer to this sin or need of mine?

How does this passage call on you to change the way you live?

How would you be different if this truth were powerfully real to you?
